

2019 Justice for All Fellowship Application

OVERVIEW

The Ohio Legal Assistance Foundation (The Foundation) will award two-year Justice for All Fellowships to outstanding recent law school graduates with a passion for public service. The Foundation supports fellowship projects which address unmet civil legal needs facing low-income individuals and families in Ohio. Each fellow must work together with an Ohio host organization to develop a proposed project.

Fellows will receive a competitive salary, benefits, and up to \$6,000 in annual educational loan repayment assistance.

FELLOWSHIP APPLICATION TIMELINE

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Those submitting an application for the 2019 Justice for All Fellowships must meet the following requirements:

- You must be a third-year law student or a recent law school graduate who demonstrates a commitment to public interest law.
- You must be eligible and agree to take the Ohio bar examination in the summer of 2019; OR, be admitted to practice law in Ohio; OR, be licensed in another state and eligible for temporary admission before taking the Ohio bar examination.
- You must identify an Ohio organization to serve as your host organization and full-time employer during the fellowship term. Together with your host organization, you will propose a project that will allow you to use your legal skills to address civil legal needs faced by low-income individuals and families throughout Ohio.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

To apply, please submit the following, electronically in a single PDF file, in the order indicated below. Make the subject line of the email "[Your Name]—Fellowship Application" and name the attachment "[Your Last Name], [Your First Name] – Justice for All Fellowship Application."

- A signed Fellowship Application including responses to the Application Questions
- Resume
- Official law school transcript documenting no less than four semesters of attendance at an ABA-accredited law school that has been redacted to exclude your social security number, date of birth, and student ID number. DO NOT SUBMIT A TRANSCRIPT THAT INCLUDES YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER.
- A commitment from an Ohio host organization explaining in one page or less how it will ensure your success as a Justice for All Fellow
