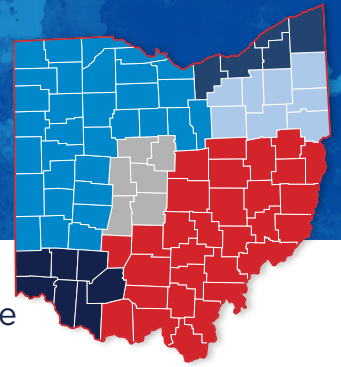

ENSURING FINANCIAL STABILITY FOR A VETERAN SUFFERING FROM COVID



Ross Anderson,* a 71-year-old Navy veteran, worked as a bus driver for a senior center when he tested positive for COVID-19 and spent ten days in the hospital. Mr. Anderson applied for unemployment benefits, but because his earnings were below the average weekly wage required by law, his application for traditional unemployment benefits was denied. At a loss for what to do next, Mr. Anderson contacted legal aid for help.

Legal aid determined that the best course of action for Mr. Anderson was to apply for Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA). Legal aid helped him complete the application, which was approved. Mr. Anderson received back payments as well as monthly PUA payments until he was fully recovered and able

to return to work. Thanks to the federal government's emergency response and legal aid, Mr. Anderson successfully navigated the pandemic and maintained his stability.
