LEGAL AID IMPROVES LIVES IN DISTRICT 4

Helping a veteran and domestic violence survivor gain safety

Once domestic violence survivors successfully escape from their abusers, they should be able to live in peace, safety, and security. Although Sarah Anderson,* a veteran and survivor of domestic violence, had previously obtained a five-year civil protection order (CPO), her abuser violated it by threatening and stalking Ms. Anderson and their child outside of her home. Ms. Anderson's abuser also tried to use the existing court case to maintain his abuse by filing to dismiss the CPO so he could resume contact with her. Fearing for her and her child's safety, Ms. Anderson turned to legal aid for help.

Legal aid helped Ms. Anderson convince the court to maintain the CPO to ensure that her abuser cannot have contact with either her or her daughter. Legal aid also provided her with additional safety planning and counseling resources. Ms. Anderson is now moving forward again to rebuild her life with her daughter, ensuring that through their safety and stability, they have hope for a brighter future.
