Preserving a family home for a proud veteran


Homeownership is a catalyst for security and generational wealth. For low-income Ohioans like Bernard McAllister,* the dream of security and wealth is lost if they don't legally own their home. Mr. McAllister, a proud veteran, lived in his family home for many years and wanted to maintain and update it. He sought help from legal aid when he learned that, despite his father willing the house to him and his siblings, he couldn't qualify for a home weatherization program because he didn't own the home.

With the full support of his siblings, who had moved out of state and weren't interested in living in the home in southeast Ohio, legal aid helped Mr. McAllister accomplish all the legal work necessary to transfer the deed to his name. Legally securing his family home not only gave Mr. McAllister stability and peace of mind, but it also enabled him to access the weatherization program, which will help him improve the home's energy efficiency, reduce his energy costs, and create an even more valuable asset for him to be able to share with future generations.
