## Fueling whole-life recovery, starting with a clean slate

The grace of a clean slate has the power to change lives for good. Veronica Mason,\* a victim of human trafficking, had tried hard to start over in life. For more than two years, she worked to stay sober. Thanks to her hard work and legal aid's help, Ms. Mason was able to establish visitation and shared custody with her eightyear-old daughter, who was in kinship care with her grandmother. When Ms. Mason's shared custody was threatened because she did not have a stable place to live, legal aid stepped in again to help.

Ms. Mason had applied for and was denied housing because of a criminal record related to her prior experience of being trafficked. Legal aid helped Ms. Mason seal her record, ensuring a clean slate and a path to new housing options. Thanks to the help she received from legal aid, Ms. Mason secured stable housing, which, in turn, allowed her to become the residential parent for her daughter, who is thriving in her mother's care.
