Ensuring a Grandparent Can Care for Her Vulnerable Grandchildren

For families grappling with the ramifications of substance use disorders, kinship caregivers are a lifeline in times of crisis. Pamela Brennan,* a devoted grandmother, sought custody of her two young grandchildren to provide the girls with a safe and stable home when her daughter was unable to care for the girls.

Legal aid not only helped Mrs. Brennan obtain custody of her grandchildren, but they also obtained a Civil Protection Order for her when her daughter became violent and threatening. Facing a protection order that prevented her from having any contact with her own mother and daughters prompted Mrs. Brennan's daughter to agree to treatment, incentivizing her to try to stabilize herself with a job. Mrs. Brennan was then able to allow her daughter supervised parenting time with the girls. As a result of legal aid, not only are Mrs. Brennan and her granddaughters safe and stable, but they are also able to have healthy and safe interactions with Mrs. Brennan's daughter as she works to overcome her substance use disorder.
